PROP 1	YES	Proposition 1 would authorize \$4 billion in bonds to help address the state's housing crisis. It would provide critical resources to increase the supply of affordable housing for California's low-income families, veterans, farmworkers, and other vulnerable populations.
PROP 2	YES	Proposition 2 will provide up to \$2 billion to build housing and offer treatment for homeless individuals struggling with their mental health.
PROP 3	YES	Proposition 3 authorizes \$8.9 billion in bonds for water infrastructure, groundwater management, watershed natural resource protection and restoration. The initiative will provide important funding to expand access to safe drinking water in California's most disinvested communities.
PROP 5	NO	Proposition 5 helps wealthy, older homeowners move into larger and more expensive homes, while worsening tax burden inequities between older homeowners and younger residents who are majority of color. California should level the property tax playing field, not exacerbate inequities.
PROP 6	NO	If passed, Proposition 6 would repeal SB 1, a recently passed transportation funding measure, and would require voter approval for gas tax increases. This measure would make it difficult to finance necessary maintenance and upgrades to our transportation infrastructure.
PROP 10	YES	Proposition 10 gives local communities the power to enact common-sense policies that protect tenants from skyrocketing rent increases.
